

COODEN BEACH GOLF CLUB

DRESS CODE

COURSE

All players must wear recognisable golf attire whilst on the course.

Blue denim clothing, training shoes, T-shirts, football or rugby shirts or shorts, track suit tops or bottoms are not considered to be golfing attire.

Cargo or camouflage shorts or trousers are not acceptable.

Shorts when worn must be tailored shorts.

Socks, worn with shorts must be ankle length and predominantly white. Training socks are not considered to be suitable golfing attire.

Shirts should not be worn outside the waistband of trousers or shorts.

Peaked caps shall be worn the correct way round.

CLUBHOUSE

AGMs & EGMs

Gentlemen must wear a jacket and tie at these meetings whichever room they are held in.

Spike Bar

It is expected that golfers and persons using this bar will wear recognisable golfing attire or smart casual clothing. Golf shoes may be worn but should be cleaned after play. It is not permissible to wear hats in the clubhouse and waterproof clothing should not be worn in the clubhouse after play. The wearing of shoes without socks is not permitted.

Mixed Lounge

Golf shoes are not permitted to be worn in the Mixed Lounge.

On Sundays after 12 noon Gentlemen must wear a jacket and tie. In the case of children under 14 years of age, it will be permissible for them to wear smart casual clothing.

Herbert Fowler Room

If used for a function then the dress code for the function as advertised will apply.

Dining Room

Sundays

After 12 noon, Gentlemen must wear a jacket and tie unless this is specifically relaxed by the Captain or General Manager. In an effort to encourage members to entertain children in the Dining Room, the dress code is relaxed for children under 14 years of age, who may wear smart casual clothing.

All Other Times

Apart from the above, smart casual wear is the appropriate apparel around the Clubhouse. Excluded from the definition of smart casual wear are Blue Denims, T- shirts, shirts without collars, beach shorts, cargo trousers or shorts, Camouflage wear and trainers. Casual shirts must not be worn outside trousers and should be tucked in. It is not permissible for waterproof clothing to be worn in the clubhouse after play, and the wearing of hats in the clubhouse is also not permitted.

Club Functions

A Dress Code for individual Club Functions will be posted on the notice advertising the event but will normally be Jacket & Tie unless otherwise stated.

Competitions

In open competitions such as The Cooden Beach Bowl and the Alexander Grant and any other 27 or 36 hole competitions where the Dining Room or the Herbert Fowler Room are used for lunch, golfers may wear golfing attire but cannot wear shorts or golf shoes in these areas.

Golfing Societies / Charity Days / Pro Am Tournaments

The organisers of these events will receive notice of our dress requirements prior to the event and if players in these events arrive inappropriately attired then they will be advised by the Course Marshall that they will not be allowed on the course until they are appropriately attired by conforming to the dress code.

Etiquette

This Dress Code has been designed to promote a courtesy to all which helps create and maintain a pleasant ambience to all users of the golf club. Members are asked to maintain this standard which is thought to be what should reasonably be expected at a club of the standing of Cooden Beach Golf Club.
